Sir,

With reference to the subject cited above the Khasi Jaintia Presbyterian Synod, Mihngi would like to substantiate that as per the provision provided by the Indian Constitution, Thomas Jones Synod College was established by the Khasi Jaintia Presbyterian Synod Mihngi on the 5th August, 1997 as a Religious Minority Institution. The same has been confirmed as per Government No.EDN,811/86- "The Governor of Meghalaya is pleased to make the following rules governing the maintenance grant to Aided Colleges of Meghalaya".

Reference 2(g) "Minority College" means a college established and administered by a religious or linguistic Minority having the right to do so under Clause (1) of Article 30 of the Constitution of India.

No. EDN,811/86- The Governor of Maghalaya is pleased to make the following rules governing the maintenance grant to Aided Colleges in Meghalaya.

1. Short title and commencement.

(1) These rules may be called " The Meghalaya ( Aided Colleges Maintenance Grant-in Aid ) Rules, 1986.

(2) They shall come into force with effect from the date of this notif

-ication.

2. Definition.

In these rules unless where is anything repugnant in the subject or context-

(a)"Aided College" means any College recieving grant-in-aid from the

Government under these rules. (b) "College" means a college affiliated to a University recognised by the State Government and having jurisdiction over the State of Meghalaya.

(c) "Director" means the Director of Public Instruction, Meghalaya.

(d) "Form" means a form appended to these rules.
(e) Governing Body" means the Governing Body constituted for a College in accordance with the orser and instruction, if any, of the Govt. "Grant-in-aid" means the Maintenance Grant Grant-in-aid.

(g) "Minority College" means a College established and administered by a religious or linguistic Minority having the right to do so under Clause (1) of Article 30 of the Constitution of India.

## GRANT\*IN→AID.

( Maintenance Grant, )

3. Grant-in-aid to existing Colleges to continue.
(1) Every aided college shall continue to recieve the grant-in-aid so

long as it fulfills the conditions laid down in these rules.

(2) The existing colleges which are enjoying the adhoc maintenance grant shall continue to recieve the grant under the old system till they are brought under the provision of these rules.

LEligibility Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules, no college shall claim the grant-in-aid as a matter of right. Subject to the availabily ity of funds and the college satisfying the conditions hereinafter contained and such other conditions as the Director may from time to time lay down, the State Government, may at its discretion give grant-in-aid to colleges in the state which are affiliated to a University have jurisdiction over the State of Meghalaya and considered as such by it :

Provided that the Government may, in respect of minority colleges, dispense eith any of the conditions or requirements and to such extent as it may deem fit for the purpose of giving aid.

Rules in not to apply to cortain colleges.

These rules shall not be applicable to those colleges which are in reciept of grant-in-aid under the Deficit System, unless they are otherwise brought under the provisions of these rules.

Power of the Director to cause the College to be inspected.
Where an application is made for grant-in-aid, the Director shall EXX cause such college to be inspected by an officer authorised by him in this behalf as regards the justification or otherwise of the college torrecieve such aid.

Undertaking. No grant-in-aid shall be given unless its Governing Body gives an un-

in-aid shall be given unless its Governing Body gives an unhg in writing by a formal resolution passed to the effect that in comply with the provisions of these rules and such instructions are insured to s may be issued from time to time by the Director with regard to /in-aid, and that the breach of any provision of those rules or instruction issued by the Director with regard in this behalf shall or such college liable to forfeiture of the grant-in-aid (Form G. I) 11 be used for the resolution for this purpose.

nditions for grant-in-aid.

A College seeking the grant-in-aid shall have a permamnent income, whether from endowment or other sources, which when supplemented by grant-in-add, shall be adequate to discharge its obligation under these rules. This permanent income should amount at least twenty five percent of the approved expenditure excluding the opening balance.

2) Without the special sanction, previouly obtained, of the Director OF of such officer duly authorised, no Aided college shall undertake any work or incur any expenditure which would involve the reduction of the closing balance below the working balance prescribed under

Sub-rule (1). 3) The college shall also have a Reserve Fund of the amount prescribed in the table below or such as may be specified by rules of the Aff-

iliated Unversity, which ever is higher.

Provided that the amount specified in the said table shall be subject revision under order of the Director. ject revision under order of the Director or such other competent authority of the University, in this regard.

(4) The Reserve Fund shall be maintained in the name of the college and

shall be deposited with any Mationalised Bank or the Post Office Saving Bank or any other Scheduled Bank as approved for the purpose by the epumpetent authority of the University, and shall be administered jointly by the Director and the Secretary of the Governing Body of the college concerened. Norally, withdrawal of money out of

this fund is not admissible. Provided that in the event of any omission or failure on the part of the Governing Body to discharge any claim pertaining to the salof the Governing Body to discharge any claim pertaining to the salaries of the staff or such other obligation due by it under the rules, or in the case of meeting expenditure of an emergent nature for which no money could otherwise be provided, necessary amount may be drawn from the Reserve Fund, as a last resort, A resolution to this effect should be passed by the Governing Body, and such withdrawal should receive prior approval of the Director or any xff officer authorised by him in this behalf. The amount se drawn shall be utilised specifically and solely for the purpose for which it was meant and accounts in this regard duly maintained:—

Provided further that the amount so withdrawn from the Reserve Fund should be replenished within a period to be specified by the Director

ised by him in this behalf. (6) All teaching and nonteaching posts in every aided college shall be sanctioned by the Director or any officer authorised by him in this behalf on the scales of pay as prescribed by the Government from

time to time. (7) The Geverning Body of the mided college shall make appointment only against the sanctioned posts with the prior approval of the Directe or or such other authorised officer. The account and other records maintained by the college shall be open to inspection by the auditor or the inspecting officer authorised by the Director and also by the Examiner of Local Accounts, Meghalays. Every aided college shall levy only such fees and at such rates as may be approved by the Director from time to time.

Proper accounts shall be maintained in respect to all income and expenditure of the college in the form in which such accounts are requ-

ired to be maintained.

The college shall not open new class without giving full justificati ion and without the prior approval of the appropriate authority. The Governing Body shall not close down the college, not being a minority college, or an existing Exitexe class in the college without giving full justification and without the prior approval of the Director.

Where as a result of-

(a) the closure of an aided college or any class or classes in any

aided college, or

(b) the withdrawal of grant-in-aid, any student or employee becomes surplus/displaced.such, student or employee, as the case may be, shall be absorbed as far as may be practicable, in such other college as the Director may direct. On the closure or abolition of an aided college, Government may claclaim a fair share of any balance of the funds at the credit of the college and of the sale proceeds of any building, furniyure or other property for which the grant or any portion thereof, may have been utiliscd.

A College shall employee adequate number of qualified teachers and other staff as the Director may approve under the norms specified

from time to time.

Enrolment and Attenance. The number of students on the roll of an aided college shall not fall below the number on the basis of which grant-in-aid was initially granted and the number of working days of the college shall not fall below the minimum fixed by the affiliateng university or the Government; and where the number of students fall below seventy-five percent of the above mentioned number, or the number of working days falls below the minimum prescribed, proportionate reduction may be made in the grant-in-aid payable to the college.

(2) The normal minimum enrolment for the purpose of this rule shall be

The above minimum enrolment may be relaxed by the Director in case o of existing colleges of the three year's standing or colleges situated in backward rural areas or colleges for girls education or minerity colleges or purely residential colleges falling under "Special Education if such relaxation is considered necessary for extention of educational opportunities.

roceeding college which are yet to attain complete recognition/ affile will be entitled to aid upto the stage so recognised and the admissib! of the staff should be commuted accordingly as enumerated here in after stommege reduction or susponsion of grants-in-aid.

. Grants -in -aid to a college may be stopped , reduced or suspended at

time by the Director on the fillowing grounds:-

a) That the coverning Body of the college falls without any reasonable excuse to comply with any of the provinsion of these rules or instruct given by the Director .

b) If one or more of the conditions for recognition, discipline organisation

or instruction in the college is unsatisfactory.

c) That for lack of discipline or otherwise the addemic standard in the college has been adversely affected.

(d) That one or more of the conditions for recognition of the college of for

grants-in-aid has been violated.

(e) The grants-in-aid shall not be stopped, reduced or suspended excent. after giving the Coverning Body of the college a reasonable oppurtunity for showing cause against the proposed action .

Approved income

The approved ancome of a college include:-

(a) The total income derive from tution fees, fines, sbscriptions, endowment and grants from local Bodies or authorities but does not include any grants paid from the state fund .

(b) Voluntary contributions or donations collected, and

(c) Voluntary contribution by the parents or gaurdians for construction of any building for the college or its hostel .

Note: No aided college shall levy or collect any donation compalsorily fro

any students or his parent or guardian .

(1)The approved expenditure of a college shall comprise of the salaries of the teacher and staff appointed withe approval of the Director or any other officer authorised by him in this behalf to the extent and accordi to the scale of may as prescribed by the Government from time to time.

(2) The courses of studies/ subjects will be confined to those duly approv by the Government in consultation with the affiliating University and, ordinarily, the strength of the establishment shall be according to the following standard:\_

(a) The Number of teachers in each subject will be determined in accord with the provisions in the ordinance of the affiliating University on the affiliation of the college, as approved by Government .

(c) Assistant Librarian ( For college Having degree course with an enrol

(d) Assistant (i) U.D.A. - one

(ii) L.D.A. - one / (e) Grade IV

(i) College without Science Faculty (P.U.C.) - Two.

(ii) Colleg with Science Feculty (P.U.C.) (iii) Colleg with Science Faculty (Degree Pass)-Six.

(IV) College with Science Faculty (Degree Hons)-Eight

(V) College without Science Faculty

(Degree and Hons) -Four

(1) The above scale of establishment are subject to modification as relaxation when necessary under orders of the Director. ote:-(ii) Pay of under qualified teachers shall not be admissible for a ss ment of the grants-in-aid payable to a college unless other

The aided college shall always maintain out of the approved income a balance of not less than 25% as share towards the salaries of the teachers and staff .

Special Maintenance Frant

Subject to availibility of funds, special maintenance grant may ho sanctioned to any college on any of the following considerations and subject to any conditions which the Director may fix:-

(a) a temperary measure when such college is newly established er newly brought on to the list of aided colleggs or is permitted

to open a new course of studies.

(b) When the management of any college is unable to provide its share to be eligible for grants-in-ail as otherwise proviede under these rules.

(c) For expansion of girls, Education, or

(d) Where the college quarter to the need of backward and remote areas or of college committies which deserve special attention as may be determined by the Government from time to time .

Application for grants-in-eid . 16.

Every application for grants-in-aid by a college ahall be made in form G.II . and shall be addressed to the Director.

17. Sanction of grants-in-aid.

(1) Subject to the provision of these males, Government may saction the grant-in-aid on such conditions as it may deem necessary.

(2) The saction for grant-in-ail shall ordinarily be reviewed by the Director every year for the purpose of modifying, whereever necessary, the amount thereof.

(3) The grant-in-aid will be payable monthly on bills drawn in the prescribed form by the Secretary of the Governing Body of the College and countersigned by the Director or any authorised

Note :- Bills shall be supported by a statement of claims in Form G III (part I to III ) together with a statement of computation as at item 5 of Form G. III.

18. Register of Grant-in-aid Bills.

The countersigning autority shall maintain a "Register of Grantin-aid Bills" incorporating necessary details in respect of each aided college in Form G.IV.

19. Adjustment/Deduction of claim.

Where any amount of grent-in-eid is senctioned in excess or where any portion of it remains unspent, such amount shall be adjusted

from the subsequent monthly grant-in-aid.

Note:- It shall be responsibilty of the Governing Body to make good from its own funds the shortfall and the salaries of the staff shall in no way be paid less than what is due to them.
